The University Clinical Aptitude Test (UCAT) is an admissions test, used by a consortium of UK and partner universities to help select applicants to their medical and dental degree programmes. Refer to the <u>UCAT 2025</u> page for details about the changes which were announced ahead of the 2025 test cycle. The test is used alongside other selection criteria such as your academic qualifications and interviews. The UCAT is a computer-based test, delivered in Pearson VUE test centres throughout the UK and worldwide.
