

The Gatsby Benchmarks is one method by which schools monitor the effectiveness of their Careers programmes. Gatsby Benchmark 1 is A Stable Careers Programme and a recent update to this benchmark is that Careers Programmes and information should now detail how parents and carers will be engaged throughout the year. In addition to monthly careers newsletters and a range of parents' information evenings (GCSE options, Sixth Form information evening, careers programme information evening, UCAS information evening) we would also recommend that parents sign up to receive weekly information about careers opportunities for their child. 
